STABLES, VEHICLE & CARAVAN PARKING

1. STABLES

Stables should be reserved at time of entry on payment of the fee below. This entitles the exhibitor to the use of a stable from 7pm on the night of reservation until 6.30pm on the following night.

Straw will not be available or allowed in the stables area.

We will provide a base bed in all stables, if you wish to bring your own additional shavings please do so, alternatively exhibitors will be able to buy bedding at excellent rates on a cash and carry basis from the Stable Managers office.

All stables **MUST** be cleaned out by 07.00 hrs each day. When there is a change over in stables a £10 deposit will be required. This will be returned providing the stable is left in a clean state on departure.

Hessian drop sheeting will not be provided.

In the interests of safety **NO portable cookers** will be permitted in the stables.

2. HORSE TRANSPORT

Vehicles may park **FREE OF CHARGE** in the designated vehicle park in the equine area situated north of the Showground. Follow traffic management signs to this destination.

3. STAYING OVERNIGHT

Lorries staying overnight will be parked in a separate area to day lorries.

4. CARAVANS

£20.00 (inc VAT) per caravan per night.

To be booked and paid for at time of entry.

Exhibitors caravans will be allowed access to the designated equine caravan parking areas.

5. CARS

PRIVATE CARS WILL NOT BE ADMITTED TO THE EQUINE AREA ON THE SHOWGROUND. They will be accommodated in Car Park 3. Admission to the Official Car Parks will be free of charge. **NO CARAVANS OR CAMPING VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED IN ANY CAR PARK.**

6. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

A Muslim Prayer room will be available all day Tuesday to Friday at the Arthur Rank Centre.

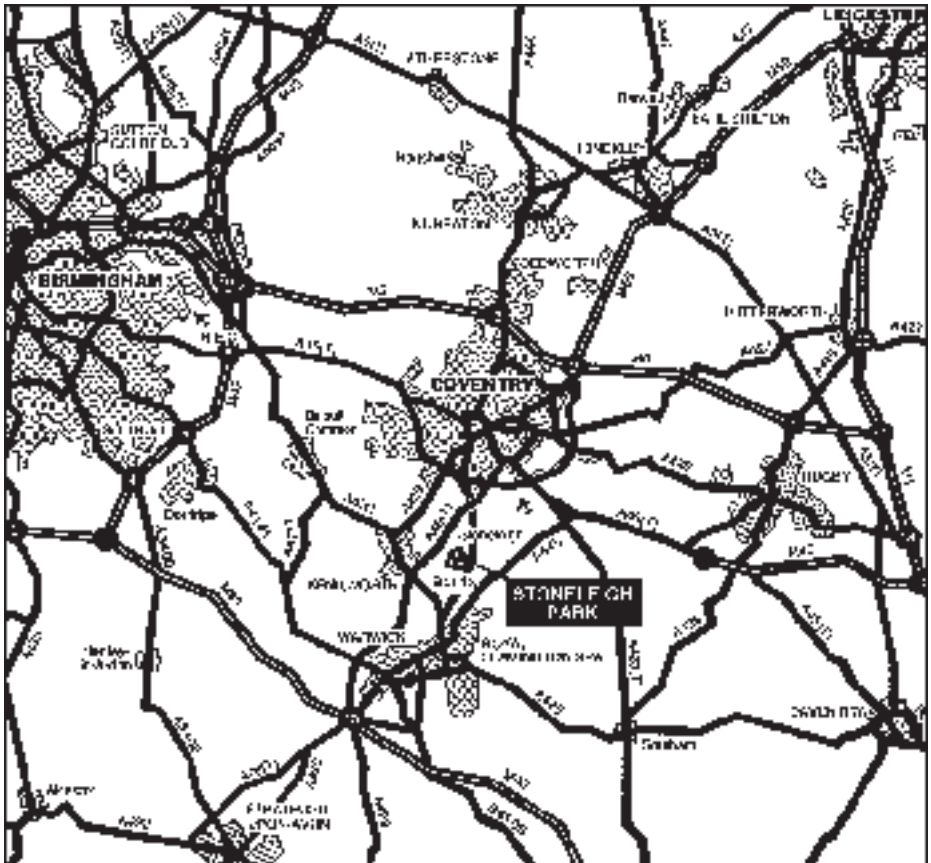

Regulations applying to EQUINES

Definitions

'the Society' or "RASE" - Royal Agricultural Society of England

1. Exhibitor's risk and responsibility

Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANYWAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants, or agents, or to any exhibit, or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any crate, package, show-case or other article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit, or any other property brought into the Showground or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to, the Society's Show.

EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or rising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Each exhibitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Society for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants or agents. Any fine imposed upon an exhibitor, or a person employed by him, for infringing the regulations or disobedience to the order of the Stewards, shall be recoverable from the exhibitor as a debt due to the Society, and until such payment shall debar such exhibitor from exhibiting at any future show of the Society.

Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers. All Light Horse Colts 2 years and over must be shown in a bridle and bit.

Exhibitors in the Private Driving Classes should ensure that they are adequately covered by third-party insurance. Horse Passports: exhibitors must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show.

2. Animal Health Act

Animals which are subject to restrictions under the Animal Health Act 1981 (as amended) or the Animal and Animal Products (Import and Export) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (as amended) will not be allowed onto the Showground.

3. Application for entry forms

4. Closing dates for entries

No entry will be admitted for exhibition unless the necessary entry form, properly completed, as required by the regulation herein contained, signed by the exhibitor (or his/her agent) and accompanied by the necessary fees, shall have been delivered to the Equine Office, RASE, Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire CV8 2LZ, on or before the date appointed for the closing of entries, as set out on page 2 of the Schedule.

No Substitution of Entries will be allowed.

5. Ownership of exhibits

Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry, except in the case of a stallion on hire (see Regulation 19). Every animal at the Show must be exhibited in the name of the person who entered it and whose name appears in the catalogue. This does not prevent an animal being sold after entry provided it is exhibited in the name of the person who entered it. An entry or entries may be submitted on behalf of an Exhibitor by an Exhibitor's Agent, but in no case can the Agent be described as the joint exhibitor unless he or she is bona fide, the joint owner of the exhibit entered.

See also additional regulations applicable to Ridden Hunters.

6. Entries from minors

Entries from persons under 18 years of age shall be accepted only provided the entry forms are countersigned by the parent, guardian or trustee of the entrant, who shall be held responsible for the correctness of the entry, and for compliance with the regulations of the show. Any entry made in contravention of this regulation and inadvertently accepted may be cancelled.

Regulations - EQUINE

7. Completion of entry forms

Every exhibitor or competitor shall be held responsible for the correctness of his/her entry. If, when called upon to prove its correctness, he/she fails to do so, the entry in question shall not be accepted, or if already accepted may be cancelled or the exhibit may be disqualified, and any award made to it cancelled. If it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Society, whose decision shall be final, that an exhibitor or competitor has knowingly signed an incorrect certificate, or has attempted to obtain a prize by any means deemed by the Society to be unfair, all awards made to such exhibitor or competitor in any class may be cancelled, and he/she may be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society; and in the case of livestock the animals in the possession of such exhibitor at the time of disqualification may be rendered ineligible for competition at the Shows of the Society to be held in the year of such disqualification and the year following. The fixing of any artificial contrivance or device to or tampering with or faking any livestock shall for the purpose of this regulation be treated as an attempt to obtain a prize by unfair means.

The name and residence of the breeder of each animal entered for exhibition shall be stated when known; or, when not known, sufficient explanation shall be given. Neglect to comply with this regulation may involve the disqualification of the entry or the forfeiture of any prize awarded. The Society will not be responsible for any inaccuracy in any pedigree or other particulars inserted in the catalogue.

8. Judges interest in animals

No exhibitor may enter or show a horse or pony in a class where the judge of that class, as stated in the schedule, has owned, produced, had at livery in his/her yard, or received financial gain from the animal. A horse or pony bred by a stallion owned by the judge or a mare which has visited his/her stud purely for the purpose of covering shall be exempt from this exclusion.

9. Substitution of Judges

The Society reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those named in the Schedule or make additional appointments. Where time permits exhibitors will be informed of the change or via the website www.royalshow.org.uk.

10. Cancellation of entries/Amalgamation of classes

The Society, in its absolute discretion, may refuse an entry or cancel any entry already accepted, or the Honorary Show Director may decline at any stage to admit any proposed exhibit, or order the removal of or remove, at the expense and risk of the exhibitor, any exhibit already delivered. Whenever under this regulation an entry is refused or cancelled, or any exhibit is refused admission or removed, the fees paid for such entry may, at the discretion of the Society, be refunded, and, if refunded, shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society.

Except in the classes for Heavy Horse Teams and Turnouts; if the number of entries received in any one class is less than 3, and the number of exhibitors is less than 2 per class, then the class will be amalgamated where possible, or, if not, cancelled, and the entry fees returned.

11. Adjustment of entries

The Company reserves the right to adjust the number of entries per exhibitor in relation to accommodation available.

12. Exclusion from exhibiting

No person who shall have been shown to the satisfaction of the Society properly to have been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at shows, sales or exhibitions of any other Breed or Agricultural Society, Association or Club, and no person who is under exclusion or suspension from any Breed or Agricultural Society, Association or Club shall be allowed to exhibit at this or any other Show of the Society.

13. Incivility and expulsions from Showground

Any act of discourtesy to any judge, steward, show official or show organiser on the part of the exhibitor, groom, rider, driver or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such official disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

The Honorary Show Director shall have the power to remove from the Showground the stock or property belonging to any exhibitor who shall infringe any of the regulations or conditions of the Show, or who shall refuse to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards.

14. Age of exhibits

In stating the age of a horse it is only necessary to give the year in which it was born, except in the case of yearlings and foals, when the exact date of birth must be given. The name of the sire of the foal must also be stated on the entry form. Foals must be at least 3 weeks old at date of Show.

15. Mare with foal at foot

All foals must be the offspring of the mares with which they are exhibited, and must accompany their dams in the judging ring.

16. Height of exhibits

Animals entered in classes with conditions as to height (except those for which an official height certificate has been issued by the Joint Measurement Board Ltd. and Ponies for which a height certificate has been issued by the Breed Society on registration) or issued by an equivalent body in a Member State, may be measured with their shoes on, at the request of the Judge or Stewards. 1 centimetre will be allowed for the shoes. Young Stock- Show Hacks and Ponies entered in the Riding Pony Breeding Young Stock classes will be measured in the Measuring Box provided in the Horse Lines.

Life Certificates: Where a life certificate or a Valid Annual Certificate has been issued by the Joint Measurement Board for an animal this must be produced for inspection by the Veterinary Officer in charge of measuring, otherwise the animal concerned will be measured. Exhibitors will be given a measuring slip as proof that the certificate has been checked which must be handed to the Steward in charge at the ringside in order for the animal to gain entry to its class.

No animal will be allowed to compete in its class unless the appropriate measuring slip is produced at the ringside.

17. Transfers

The Judge will transfer any horse in a Light or Middle-weight class to a heavier weight class, if he/she considers that the horse exceeds the specified weight.

Transfers in height-restricted classes will not be allowed other than in the In-hand Hacks& Riding Horses and Riding Pony Breeding Young Stock classes, where the NPS Measurement Scheme will apply.

18. Hired stallions

A stallion hired for the season will be considered to be the property of the person to whom it is hired.

19. Parade of prize winners

All Prize winning animals in the Heavy Horse Section must parade (unless a Veterinary/Chief Steward's Certificate is produced to confirm the animal's incapacity to do so), otherwise any prize awarded to such exhibits will be withheld.

Exhibitors and their Horses/Ponies must be properly turned out to an acceptable standard. Horses and Ponies must remain plaited for parades. (NB: Please note Regulation 1).

Light Horses and Ponies will not be required to parade.

20. Dress - handlers

Grooms/attendants appearing with animals in judging rings MUST be of smart appearance and in proper dress code (not jeans), with appropriate headwear.

21. Leaders

The leader who enters the ring with the horse/pony must remain with the animal throughout the class. Only in special circumstances with the permission of the judge may another person trot it out.

Fees

22. Fees

Fees (including stabling charges) for all horses/ponies and vehicle parking arrangements and charges are as stated on pages 6 and 7. Entry fees shall be paid by cheque, money order or postal order made payable to 'RASE' or by Credit Card - MasterCard or Visa.

23. Return of fees

Entry fees are NOT returnable, except under regulations 10 & 11, or otherwise as directed by the Society, in respect of individual animals which are withdrawn before the Show or are not forward at the Show even though a Veterinary Certificate is produced to account for the withdrawal or absence of such entry.

In the event of the area from which entries for the Show are to be conveyed being declared to be in a Movement Prohibited Area, the entry fees in respect of such entries will be refunded.

Admission

24. Arrival & departure

Notification of arrival times will be confirmed with Show Documents.

The Equine Gate (Gate 3) will open during the following times for admission to the Showground:

Regulations - EQUINE

25. Admission passes

Admission passes will be allocated as follows: Two passes for first animal. One additional pass for each subsequent animal.

(NB passes will only be allocated for foals if entered separately in a foal class.)

Exhibitors may purchase additional day tickets. No refunds will be given on tickets purchased.

Exhibitors may be fined up to £50 in each case of transfer, or other improper use of any badge/ticket. In addition, any exhibitor infringing this regulation may risk expulsion from the Showground for this and subsequent events.

General

26. Concealing exhibits during show

During the time the Show is open to the public no sheeting or other material shall be affixed to any part of the stables in such a way that any animal is concealed from public view.

27. Decoration of exhibits

No animal shall be decorated with colours other than the Society's or breed societies' prize rosettes won at current Show.

28. Sale of exhibits

Exhibitors may sell their stock, either privately or through a properly appointed agent having an authorised office in the Showground. The Society does not accept responsibility for or in connection with sales or other comparable transactions effected in the Showground.

29. Display of Names during Judging

Exhibitors are prohibited from displaying the sponsor's name (other than the current RASE sponsor of the section, then only as authorised by the Society) in any form whilst the animals are being judged.

30. Exhibiting/Parading of Horses/Ponies

All competitive animals present at the Show must be presented for judging, unless a Veterinary Certificate is produced to confirm the animal's incapacity to do so. Failure to comply with this ruling may result in an exhibitor being banned for one year or more. All persons in charge of exhibits shall be subject to the orders of the Honorary Show Director and Stewards and shall be required to parade or exhibit the animals in their charge at such times as may be directed, otherwise any prize awarded to such exhibits will be withheld. It shall be the sole responsibility for all exhibitors to make prior arrangements for the leading of their exhibits. Smoking by persons in charge of animals during judging or during parades/displays is strictly prohibited.

31. Mobile Phones

The use of mobile phones in the judging rings is prohibited.

32. Fodder for exhibits

Hay will be available at £5.00 per bale and should be ordered and paid for when making entries. Green food will be supplied to exhibitors free of cost but neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by the supply of such fodder.

33. Removal of Manure

All Stables **MUST** be cleaned out by 07.00 hrs each day commencing on the Monday prior to the Show.

Prizes/Trophies

34. Prizes offered

See respective breed classification for value of prizes offered.

35. Withholding prizes

A judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.

36. Championship prizes

First and Second prize winners must, where eligible, compete for the championship prizes, or they will be liable to the forfeiture of their class prizes.

37. Forfeiture of prizes

The Honorary Show Director, on the report of a steward, shall have power, on the infringement of any of these or other prescribed regulations or conditions, to subject the exhibitor to a fine of £25, and to the forfeiture of any prize to which he/she may be entitled (in addition to all other consequences attaching to such infringement).

38. Despatch of trophies and prize money

Winners of RASE trophies must present their trophy form (which is attached to the Prize Card concerned) to the Equine Office in order to collect the trophy before leaving the Showground. In certain instances the Society does, however, reserve the right, at its discretion, to withhold certain trophies from being taken from the Showground. Cheques for the prizes awarded at the Show will be sent by post to the exhibitors concerned after the Show. Any outstanding accounts due to the Society will be set-off against any prize money or other amount owed to the exhibitor.

Health & Safety

39. Health and Safety Regulations at Agricultural Shows

In accordance with the Health & Safety legislation all livestock exhibitors/stock attendants and equestrian exhibitors/competitors/grooms must now comply with the above.

Horse walks have been laid out by the Society and ridden, driven and in-hand horses must be kept within these designated routes and take guidance from Officials or Stewards at crossing points etc.

Total separation of horses and the general public may not always be possible and if an exhibitor has a nervous or highly strung animal he should consider whether it is prudent for him to risk bringing this animal to a busy agricultural show.

Livestock exhibitors are reminded that the show environment can be upsetting for livestock, even those of normally placid temperament. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament must not be brought to the showground. When, in the opinion of the Society's Officers, the Police, the Health & Safety Executive or other competent authority an animal's behaviour poses an immediate threat to life and limb of people in its immediate vicinity the Society reserves the right to instruct an authorised person to mitigate such threat in such manner as shall to that authorised person seem appropriate, not excluding the humane destruction of the said animal and by exhibiting at the Royal Show exhibitors are deemed to authorise such person or persons to so act. Exhibitors by exhibiting at the Royal Show acknowledge and agree that the Society, its employees, servants and agents shall not be liable for any such matters as are referred to in this Regulation and in particular but not by way of limitation that the Society shall not be liable for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect or consequential) suffered as a consequence of the Society instructing such person or persons as are referred to above. Further, each exhibitor by exhibiting at the Royal Show hereby indemnifies and agrees to indemnify the Society, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liability, claims and costs which result there from.

40. Dogs

Dogs are allowed on the Showground on non retractable leads. Please note that there is strictly no admittance to the following areas: Livestock Lines, Food and Drink Halls and all restaurants. Assistance dogs are exempt.

41. Leading Horses (including Mares and Foals)

No person may lead more than one animal when moving to and from the rings.

42. Hard hats

It is the sole responsibility of riders to ensure that at all times while on horseback, they wear correctly fitted protective headgear which complies with BSEN 1384 and PAS 015 and Chin Straps must be securely fastened. The Company accepts no responsibility for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

43. Lunging of animals

Lunging of animals is not permitted in the Collecting Rings when judging is taking place.

Health & Welfare of Animals

44. Welfare

No person shall cause or permit the transport of an animal that is unfit by reason of it being in the state of being newborn, diseased, infirm, ill, injured or fatigued or having given birth within the preceding 48 hours or likely to give birth during transport or for any other reason, in compliance with The Welfare of Animals during Transport Order 1997 or any legislation in force at the time.

45. Welfare of Animals During Transport

The new legislation, which came into force in January 2007, brings in new rules covering the movement of animals. If you move horses as part of your business activities then you will be affected. Under the new rules everyone transporting animals commercially must comply. Please see www.defra.gov.uk for further details.

46. Certification of Health (Importing/Exporting)

Livestock sent direct from other Member States must be accompanied by Certification of Health in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive for the species, including additional certification granted to the UK under Community provisions.

Animals & Animal Products (Import & Export) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (as amended). Animals may be sent directly to Stoneleigh Park but RASE may not be listed as the consignee. It is the responsibility of the importer to notify the Divisional Veterinary Manager at Leicester (tel: 01162 787451) at least 24 hours prior to arrival that they are bringing animals to the Show and detailing the name of the consignee.

It is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the animal/s will be eligible to return to their Member State and are accompanied by the appropriate return certification. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the Divisional Veterinary Manager of their requirements for return certification.

47. Veterinary inspection

The Veterinary Inspectors of the Society will carry out spot checks throughout the Show of horses/ponies. Those animals originating directly from another Member State will be checked as required by the provision of Chapter II of the Council Directive 90/425/EEC.

All health documentation must be presented and the animal/s adequately identifiable.

The Society's Inspectors or those appointed by DEFRA are authorised to exclude or place in isolation any animals which, in their opinion, are exhibiting any symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any other condition which they consider warrants its exclusion or whose identity cannot be adequately established. In such an event a certificate recording the findings of the Inspector shall be handed to the person in charge of the rejected animal. Each exhibitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Society for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring in the event of the area from which entries are to be conveyed to the Show being declared a Movement Prohibited Area that such entries are not sent for exhibition.

48. Veterinary Treatment of animals whilst at the Show

Antibiotics, inhibitory substances, and other prescription only medicines are banned at the Royal Show unless they are administered under the supervision of the Royal Show Veterinary Surgeons.

49. Veterinary emergency treatment

It is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Officers may on their own authority give to any animal such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his/her representative cannot immediately be found.

50. Veterinary charges

Exhibitors will be required to re-imburse the Society for the full cost of treatment and services, and certification administered by the Society's Veterinary Officers attending animals. Accounts will be rendered after the Show.

51. Soundness and freedom from hereditary disease

In all classes animals must be free from clinical signs of disease, injury, or physical abnormality, such as would affect the animals' usefulness for breeding purposes. No veterinary inspection will be required, except when considered necessary by the judges, or on a protest being lodged.

52. Equine 'flu

It is strongly recommended that all horses and ponies are vaccinated against equine influenza when entering Stoneleigh Park. This should include two injections for primary vaccination (after 5 months of age) not less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. A further vaccination should follow not less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the 2nd injection of primary vaccination. Thereafter annual vaccinations of not more than 365 days interval should be carried out. Vaccinated horses should be accompanied by a valid vaccination history and certificate of vaccination.

53. Equine Viral Arteritis

Owners of stallions will be required to sign a declaration, incorporated in the Entry Form confirming that they have implemented the common codes of practice for control of EVA advised by the Horserace Betting Levy Board, or equivalent safeguards from those countries where the common code of practice is not operational. Animals listed under EVA Order 1995 will not be allowed onto Stoneleigh Park.

54. Drug Administration

The Society prohibits the administration to Show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question or have the effect of making it behave in the Show ring in a manner which is not natural. The Society reserves the right to drug test any exhibit on the Society's premises and/or to take blood/urine samples from any such Exhibit. Any exhibitor (or his/her representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquillisers or drugs to any Show exhibit will be dealt with at the Society's discretion. In addition the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

The presence in any form or quantity, in a horse being shown, of a substance which could, by its nature, affect its performance, is forbidden.

The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain and Judges appointed by it, may cause tests to be carried out at any affiliated show, or otherwise to determine whether this condition has been breached, the findings whereof shall be forwarded to the Rules Committee for further consideration.

Any pony taking part in classes judged under BSPS Rules will be liable to sampling, as may be any other animal at the request of a Breed Society.

55. Docking

No horse born in the United Kingdom (excluding Northern Ireland), on or after 1st January, 1950, which has been docked or nicked may be exhibited except where, in pursuance of the Docking and Nicking of Horses Act 1949, the operation of docking or nicking was necessary because of disease or injury to the tail and was authorised in writing by a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons. No docked or nicked horse which has been imported after 1st January, 1955, may be exhibited except where the importation has been authorised by an officer of the Customs and Excise or licensed by DEFRA.

56. Faking

The use of sawdust above the knee, or of resin, soap, or other substances in any form or way designed to give an artificial appearance or cording; any alteration to the natural markings of an animal or any improper means adopted in showing an animal shall disqualify such animal.

57. Strangles and Ringworm

Every exhibitor or competitor must sign in a declaration prior to the entry of any equine to Stoneleigh Park stating that: 'All horses and ponies (including donkeys and mules) that are coming onto Stoneleigh Park have not shown any symptoms of strangles or ringworm, or have been in contact with any horses or ponies (including donkey and mules) which have shown symptoms of strangles or ringworm or been in contact with premises where there has been equines infected with strangles or ringworm within 15 days prior to entry to Stoneleigh Park'. This declaration is part of the Equine entry form.

RASE Livestock Exhibitor's Privacy Policy

The Royal Agricultural Society of England respects the privacy of its exhibitors and in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 is committed to protecting your privacy and respecting the privacy of others.

The RASE and its wholly owned company Stoneleigh Park Limited will use your information together with other information for administering your remittance and animal entry forms, as well as for marketing, customer services and profiling your entries. We will disclose your interests to other departments within our group who will then use your contact details to keep you informed of future events we believe may be of interest to you. Your details will be used to compile our livestock & equine catalogue, and those exhibitors who receive an award will have their name and county posted on our website and their name and address details made available to the national press.

We will retain your personal details for at least 3 years from your last entry to enable us to process your details more efficiently should you enter again.

You have a right to ask for a copy of your information (for which we charge £10.00) and to ask us to correct any inaccuracies. To request a copy of information held, to correct inaccuracies or to have your details removed please contact the Data Protection Officer for the RASE on 02476 696969, or in writing to The Data Protection Officer, Royal Agricultural Society of England, Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire CV8 2LZ.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE

The Society reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations, or Schedules, and to settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show and exhibiting at the Royal Show shall constitute a proof of an undertaking by the exhibitor to be bound by the decision of the Society in the interpretation and application of these Regulations.

PROTESTS

An exhibitor, breeder, or member wishing to lodge a protest having reference to livestock or equines exhibited at this Show shall do so on a printed form for the purpose, obtainable from the Secretary, and shall deposit with the Society the sum of £25. If on investigation the protest is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Honorary Show Director and Steward or Stewards of the section in which the exhibit in question is included, the deposit may be forfeited to the funds of the Society. All protests shall be delivered to the RASE Office in the Showground before seven o'clock on the evening of the day on which the awards in the said section have been made, and no protests will be accepted afterwards, unless a satisfactory reason be assigned for the delay. In the case of one-day exhibits the protests shall be made immediately after the award is given.

All exhibitors and persons admitted into the Showground shall be subject to the Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Council.
