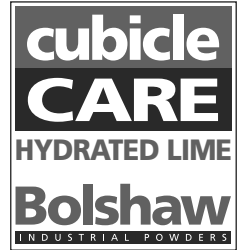
CANCELLATION STATEMENT

ACCOMMODATION FOR STOCK ATTENDANTS IN THE BLACKDOWN VILLAGE Limited accommodation is available for the use of stock attendants at the Show.

The Blackdown Village is adjacent to the livestock lines and provides 2 standards of accommodation for livestock attendants. This will be strictly allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. All rooms are twin bedded.

The cost of the room is for the Show period, up to 7 nights.

Next to the Blackdown Village, the Village Restaurant provides hot and cold meals, snacks and a licensed bar.

All rooms have duvets and bed linen supplied.

2. **CARAVANS**

The livestock caravan park is situated just outside the Showground perimeter, adjacent to the Livestock entrance. Bookings are restricted to one caravan per exhibitor. Cars may be parked next to caravans and awnings are permissible on all caravan plots. No electric hook ups are provided, however generators are permitted provided they are the silent running type. Please respect other caravan park users by not operating generators between the hours of 23.00 and 05.30.

3. **VEHICLE PARKING**

STOCK-CARRYING VEHICLES

The Stock Vehicle Park is located within the Showground, adjacent to the sheep lines and the Blackdown Village. Passes are restricted to one per exhibitor and will be parked in the Stock Vehicle Park wherever possible, however due to demand it may be necessary to redirect some vehicles to the overflow area adjacent to the caravan park.

Due to lack of space all articulated vehicles must be parked in the overflow area.

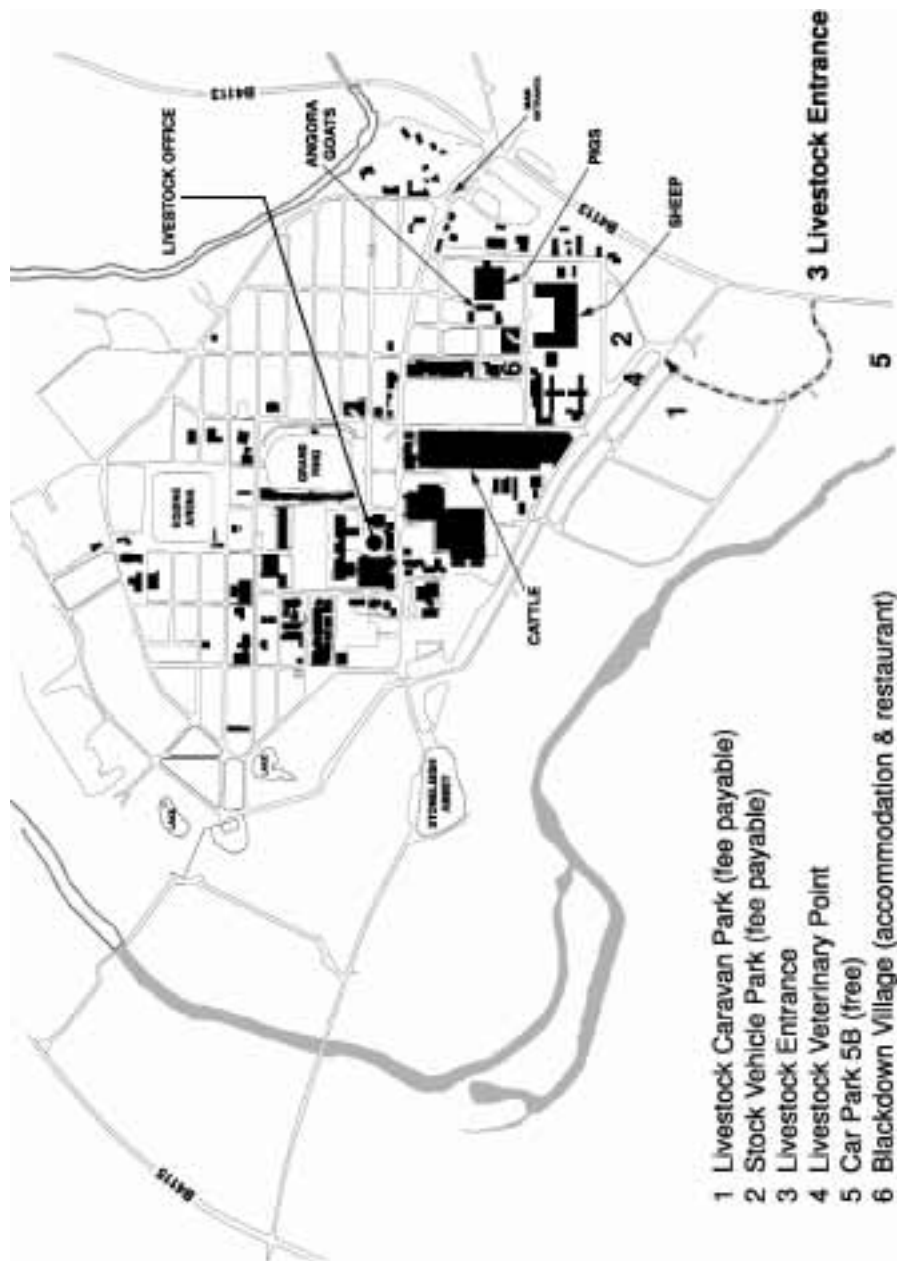
FREE PARKING

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. CATERING

Restaurant facilities are available for Stock Attendants at the Blackdown Village.

2. ADMISSION TO THE SHOW

Documents relating to exhibits, including admission tickets, will be forwarded approximately 14 days before the opening of the show.

3. DISABLED VISITORS

For information on facilities available at the Show call 02476 858340. Orange or blue badge holders do not need to apply for a special pass. Please call Fair Mobility on 01949 845189 to hire motorised scooters, wheelchairs, etc.

4. DOGS

Dogs are allowed on the showground on non retractable leads. Please note that there is strictly no admittance to the following areas: Livestock Lines, Food and Drink Halls and all restaurants. Assistance dogs are exempt.

5. ATTESTED AND ACCREDITED CATTLE ONLY

At the date of entry cattle must be free from restrictions imposed under the Tuberculosis and Brucellosis Orders. In addition the entered animals must not themselves be under individual restrictions.

6. FODDER

Hay will be available at £5.00 per bale and should be ordered and paid for when making entries. Straw will be issued free of charge. Exhibitors are at liberty to send supplementary feed. Green food will be available.

7. CHURCH SERVICES

Early morning communion services will be conducted Tuesday 7th July to Friday 10th July at 7.30am in the Chapel at the Arthur Rank Centre (6th Street). A further short service will be held at the Arthur Rank Centre at midday on Wednesday 8th July to Friday 10th July. Everyone is welcome.

A Muslim Prayer room will be available all day Tuesday to Friday at the Arthur Rank Centre.

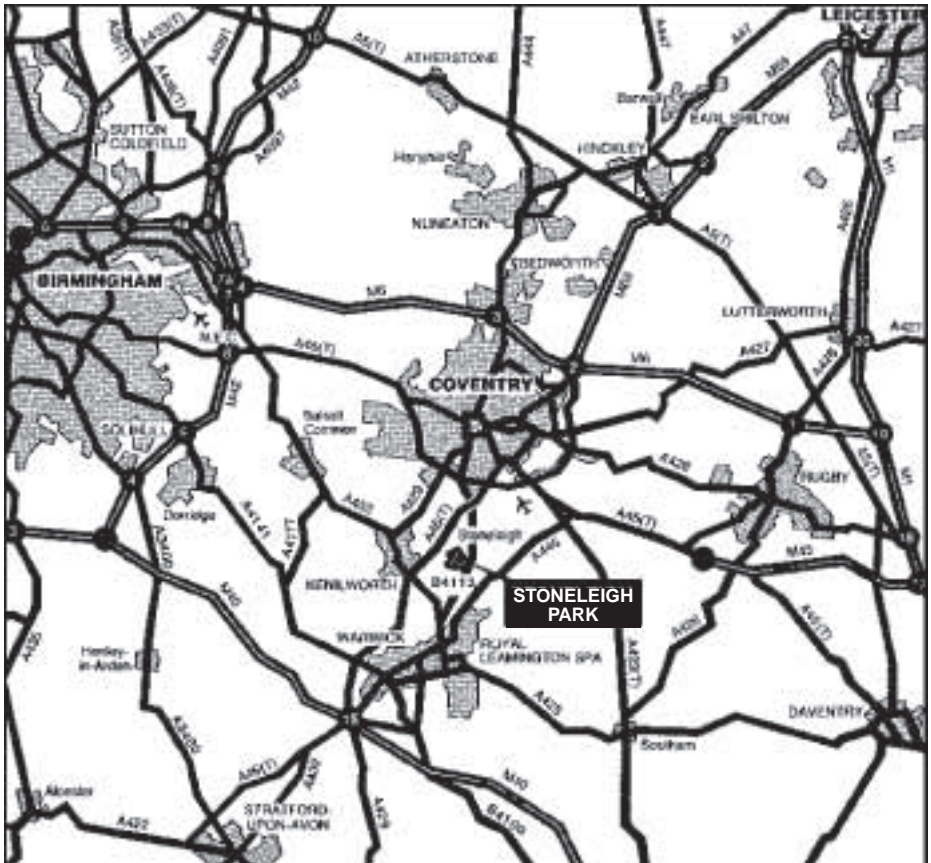

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Please read these sections **CAREFULLY** before completing your Remittance and Entry Forms.

- In the event of the number of pens booked in the Sheep Lines exceeding the number of pens available the Company reserve the right to restrict the number of pens per exhibitor. Where an exhibitor has booked pens in more than one breed, the exhibitor will NOT be allowed to transfer pens from one breed to another.

NB Texel/Charollais - note additional restrictions outlined under Breed Heading.

GENERAL SHOW REGULATIONS 93 TO 94 APPLY SPECIFICALLY TO SHEEP.

See Regulations 17 and 18 for Arrival and Departure times and 37 Health and Safety.

The terms 'Two-shear' and 'Shearling' relate to sheep born in 2007 and 2008 respectively. Lambs must be born in 2009 unless otherwise stated. Animals in each pen of sheep must have been bred in the same flock.

An animal shall not be entered in more than one class except where otherwise stated. (See Regulation 8)

- **CERTIFICATION OF HEALTH (IMPORTING/EXPORTING)**

Livestock sent direct from other Member States must be accompanied by Certification of Health in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive for the species, including additional certification granted to the UK under Community provisions. It is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the animal/s will be eligible to return to their Member State and are accompanied by the appropriate return certification. (See Regulation 46).

- **ANY OTHER BREED CLASS**

Any breed (not primitive) sheep is eligible for entry provided it does not already have a breed classification. If a breed already has a classification, no entries from that breed will be accepted in any of the Any Other Breed classes.

After the closing date the Society reserves the right to move entries in any pure breed section to the appropriate Any Other Breed section if it is deemed there are insufficient entries. Exhibitors will be informed as soon as possible after the closing date if their breed is to be moved to an Any Other Breed class, at which point they have the right to withdraw their entries and receive a full refund.

The Society reserves the right to determine which category individual breeds of sheep are classified as, and to determine which category pairs of sheep are entered into for the Sheep Pairs Championship.

If a breed is moved to AOB classes then trophies pertaining to that breed will still be awarded where appropriate.

Should a breed have sufficient entries forward, consideration will then be given to offering that breed its own classification in 2010.

Exhibitors may reserve a maximum of **FIVE stalls**, however, **ONE additional stall may be booked on the condition that it is used for a calf only.**

Regulations applying to ALL SECTIONS

Definitions

'the Society' or 'RASE' - Royal Agricultural Society of England

1. Exhibitor's risk and responsibility

Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANYWAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants, **or agents**, or to any exhibit, or any vehicle conveying any exhibit, or any crate, package, show-case or other article or thing containing or relating to any exhibit, or any other property brought into the Showground or for anything else in connection with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Show.

EACH EXHIBITOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or rising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue, and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Each exhibitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Society for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behaviour of their servants **or agents** and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants **or agents**. Any fine imposed upon an exhibitor, or a person employed by him, for infringing the regulations or disobedience to the order of the Stewards, shall be recoverable from the exhibitor as a debt due to the Society, and until such payment shall debar such exhibitor from exhibiting at any future show of the Society.

Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers.

2. Animal Health Act

Animals which are subject to restrictions under the Animal Health Act 1981 (as amended) or the Animal and Animal Products (Import and Export) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000 (as amended) will not be allowed onto the Showground.

3. Biosecurity at the Royal Show - Animal Gatherings Order 2004

The Royal Show is to be licensed by DEFRA and has a biosecurity officer whose job is to make sure that the rules are followed.

Exhibitors must follow the instructions given to them by the show organisers and the biosecurity officer. In particular, before leaving the animal area, exhibitors must cleanse and disinfect their footwear if it is contaminated with animal excreta and safely dispose of disposable clothing or change any contaminated clothing.

Prior to leaving their stock, exhibitors must also clear all bedding, used feed or animal excreta from the walkway beside their animals, dispose of this in the correct manner and clean and disinfect any equipment prior to removal from the animal area.

Entries

4. Application for entry forms

Forms of entry for the Show may be obtained from Livestock Office, tel 02476 858273/291, email livestock@rase.org.uk or online at www.royalshow.org.uk.

5. Closing dates for entries

No entry will be admitted for exhibition unless the necessary entry form, properly completed, as required by the regulation herein contained, signed by the exhibitor (or his/her agent) and accompanied by the necessary fees, shall have been delivered to Livestock Office, RASE, Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire CV8 2LZ, on or before the date appointed for the closing of entries, as set out on page 2 of the schedule.

No Substitution of Entries will be allowed.

6. Ownership of exhibits

Every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry. Every animal at the Show must be exhibited in the name of the person who entered it and whose name appears in the catalogue. This does not prevent an animal being sold after entry provided it is exhibited in the name of the person who entered it. See Dairy section for additional regulations applicable to Dairy Cattle.

7. Entries from minors

Entries from persons under 18 years of age shall be accepted only providing the entry forms are countersigned by the parent, guardian or trustee of the entrant, who shall be held responsible for the correctness of the entry, and for compliance with the regulations of the show. Any entry made in contravention of this regulation and inadvertently accepted may be cancelled.

8. Completion of entry forms and disqualification of entries

Every exhibitor or competitor shall be held responsible for the correctness of his/her entry. If, when called upon to prove its correctness, he/she fails to do so, the entry in question shall not be accepted, or if already accepted may be cancelled or the exhibit may be disqualified, and any award made to it cancelled. If it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Society, that an exhibitor or competitor has knowingly signed an incorrect certificate, or has attempted to obtain a prize by any means deemed by the Society to be unfair, all awards made to such exhibitor or competitor in any class may be cancelled, and he/she may be disqualified from exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. In the case of livestock, the animals in the possession of such exhibitor at the time of disqualification may be rendered ineligible for competition at the Shows of the Society to be held in the year of such disqualification and the year following. The fixing of any artificial contrivance or device to or tampering with or faking any livestock shall for the purpose of this regulation be treated as an attempt to obtain a prize by unfair means. **The Society's decision is final.**

The name and residence of the breeder of each animal entered for exhibition shall be stated when known; or, when not known, sufficient explanation shall be given. **Neglect to comply with this regulation may involve the disqualification of the entry or the forfeiture of any prize awarded.** The Society will not be responsible for any inaccuracy in any pedigree or other particulars inserted in the catalogue. The exact date of birth of each animal shall be stated on the entry form except in so far as sheep are concerned. (See regulation 53). **An animal shall not be entered in more than one class, except where otherwise stated.**

9. Judges interest in entries

Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the Judge appointed for the Classes they wish to enter, and are advised, in the interest of all concerned, not knowingly to enter an animal bred by, or that has been owned by the Judge appointed.

In cases where a Judge has a continuing business or financial relationship with an Exhibitor, he/she should not judge the animal(s) entered by that exhibitor, whether or not the particular animal(s) forms part of the business relationship.

Where the Judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in a particular animal(s), he/she should not judge it. In such cases, it is Royal Show practice for the Steward of the Section to arrange for the placement of that animal by another judge.

10. Substitution of Judges

The Society reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those named in the schedule or make additional appointments. Where time permits exhibitors will be informed of the change.

11. Cancellation of entries/amalgamation of classes

The Society, in its absolute discretion, may refuse or cancel any entry already accepted, or the Honorary Show Director may decline at any stage to admit any proposed exhibit, order the removal of or remove, at the expense and risk of the exhibitor, any exhibit already delivered. Whenever under this regulation an entry is refused or cancelled, or any exhibit is refused admission or removed, the fees paid for such entry may, at the discretion of the Society, be refunded. If refunded, fees shall be accepted by the exhibitor or intending exhibitor in full satisfaction of all claims against the Society.

If the number of entries received in any one class is less than 3, and the number of exhibitors is less than 2 per class, then the class will be amalgamated where possible, or, if not, cancelled, and the entry fees returned. See additional regulations applicable to sheep.

12. Adjustment of entries

The Society reserves the right to adjust the number of entries per exhibitor in relation to accommodation available.

13. Exclusion from exhibiting

No person who shall have been shown to the satisfaction of the Society properly to have been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at shows, sales or exhibitions of any other Breed or Agricultural Society, Association or Club, and no person who is under exclusion or suspension from any Breed or Agricultural Society, Association or Club shall be allowed to exhibit at this or any other Show of the Society.

14. Incivility and Expulsions from the Showground

Any act of discourtesy to any judge, steward, show official or show organiser on the part of the exhibitor, handler or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such official disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

The Honorary Show Director shall have the power to remove from the Showground the stock or property belonging to any exhibitor who shall infringe any of the regulations or conditions of the Show, or who shall refuse to comply with any instructions given by the Stewards.

Fees

15. Fees

Fees (including stalling or penning charges) for all livestock and vehicle parking arrangements and charges are as stated on pages 6 and 7. Entry fees shall be paid by cheque, money order or postal order made payable to 'RASE' or by Credit Card - Mastercard or Visa processed via WorldPay.

Regulations – ALL SECTIONS

16. Return of fees

Entry fees are not refundable, except under regulations 11, 12 and 94, or otherwise as directed by the Society, in respect of individual animals which are withdrawn before the Show or are not forward at the Show even though a Veterinary Certificate is produced to account for the withdrawal or absence of such entry.

In the event of the area from which entries for the Show are to be conveyed being declared to be in a Movement Prohibited Area, the entry fees in respect of such entries will be refunded. Entry fees will be refunded in respect of Cattle withdrawn due to a breakdown in Brucellosis Accredited Herds, provided a copy of the appropriate Official Notification Certificate is submitted at time of withdrawal.

Admission

17. Veterinary gate opening times

Livestock will be admitted to the Showground during the following times:

Saturday 4th July 18.00 to 23.00

Sunday 5th July 07.00 to 22.00

Monday 6th July 07.00 to 14.00

(Latest time of arrival for Beef and Dairy Cattle is 14.00 on Monday 6th July 2009)

Tuesday 7th July 06.00 to 07.30

Beef and Dairy Cattle arriving after 14.00 on Monday 6th July, and any other exhibits arriving after 07.30 on Tuesday 7th July may be admitted to the Showground on welfare grounds but will not be permitted to take part in any competitive classes unless satisfactory written evidence from a third party can be produced to the Honorary Show Director that the delay was not due to neglect on the part of the exhibitor, The exhibitor **MUST** have telephoned 02476 858273/291 to inform the Livestock Office of his/her late arrival. Evidence from vehicle tachographs may be considered as written evidence. Dairy Cattle must also be accompanied by other documentation specifically requested.

18. Departure of Livestock

Cattle, Sheep, Pigs and Goats: Livestock vehicles may not enter the Showground before 17.00 hrs on Friday 10th July for the loading of livestock. Movement of livestock vehicles sited on the showground will not be permitted before 17.00 hrs. Animals **MUST NOT leave their stalls or pens for loading prior to 17.00 hrs on Friday 10th July. Other than stated above, exhibits may not be removed from the Showground without a pass signed by the steward of the section concerned, or Chief Veterinary Officer. **Under no circumstances are exhibitors allowed to walk their livestock out of the Showground for loading.****

Exhibitors who do not comply with the above regulation will forfeit their prize money.

19. Admission passes

Passes for the use of exhibitors/stockpersons in charge of livestock shall be issued, subject to exhibitors' being responsible for the proper use thereof.

Exhibitors may be fined up to £50 in each case of transfer, or other improper use of any pass. In addition, any exhibitor infringing this regulation may risk expulsion from the Showground for this and subsequent events.

General

20. Data Cards

Only official Data Cards supplied by the Society can be displayed.

Exhibitors of Beef and Dairy and Dual-Purpose Cattle **MUST** display these records on the Data Boards above their exhibits. (See Regulation 83).

Exhibitors of Pigs are also requested to display records on the standard cards provided. Exhibitors of Recorded Sheep are also requested to display official records above their exhibits.

Herd or flock promotional material may be exhibited adjacent to livestock by each exhibitor in a manner within the guide-lines issued from time to time by the Society.

21. Concealing exhibits during show

During the time the Show is open to the public no sheeting or other material shall be affixed to any part of the standings, stalls or pens in such a way that any animal is concealed from public view.

22. Decoration of exhibits

No animal shall be decorated with colours other than the Society's or breed societies' prize rosettes won at current Show.

23. Sale of exhibits

Exhibitors may sell their stock, either privately or through a properly appointed agent having an authorized office in the Showground. The Society does not accept responsibility for or in connection with sales or other comparable transactions effected in the Showground.

24. Display of Names during Judging

Exhibitors/Stock Attendants are prohibited from displaying the sponsor's name (other than the current Society sponsor of the section, then only as authorised by the Society) in any form whilst the animals are being judged.

This ruling also applies to the use of boards in the pig section: exhibitors must use plain boards or cover existing logos with RASE logos supplied by the Society.

25. Exhibiting/Parading of livestock

All competitive animals present at the Show must be presented for judging, unless a Veterinary Certificate is produced to confirm the animal's incapacity to do so. Failure to comply with this ruling may result in an exhibitor being banned for one year or more. **All persons in charge of exhibits shall be subject to the orders of the Honorary Show Director and Stewards and shall be required to parade or exhibit the animals in their charge at such times as may be directed, otherwise any prize awarded to such exhibits will be withheld. It shall be the sole responsibility for all exhibitors to make prior arrangements for the leading of their exhibits. Exhibitors shall in all cases be responsible for the actions of those leading their exhibits.**

26. Dress

All stock attendants must be turned out to an acceptable standard. Stock attendants in charge of sheep, goats and pigs **MUST WEAR WHITE COATS** when leading animals in the ring during judging and parades. Stock attendants in charge of cattle must wear white coats or breed society uniform. Smoking by persons in charge of stock during judging or on parade is strictly prohibited.

27. Fodder for exhibits

Hay will be available at £5.00 per bale and should be ordered and paid for when making entries. Straw and green food will be supplied to exhibitors free of cost but neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by the supply of such fodder.

28. Removal of Manure

All Stalls/Pens must be cleaned out by 07.00 hrs each day commencing on the Wednesday prior to the Show and in accordance with the Steward's instructions. (NB. See Regulation 85 (cattle)).

29. Noise Pollution

Radios and other similar electric/electronic apparatus shall not be played so as to cause offence and disturbance to others through excessive noise. Owners of such apparatus shall at the request of a Steward or any authorised employee, servant or agent of the Society reduce the volume to an acceptable level.

30. Mobile Phones

The use of mobile phones in the judging rings is prohibited.

Prizes/Trophies

30. Prizes offered

Prizes offered relate to the number of entries catalogued in each class, except in the Cattle section where prizes will be paid on entries forward.

See respective breed classification for value of prizes offered.

32. Withholding prizes

A judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.

33. Championship prizes

First and Second prize winners must, where eligible, compete for the championship prizes, or they will be liable to the forfeiture of their class prizes.

34. Forfeiture of prizes

The Honorary Show Director, on the report of a steward, shall have power, on the infringement of any of these or other prescribed regulations or conditions, to subject the exhibitor to a fine of £25, and to the forfeiture of any prize to which he/she may be entitled (in addition to all other consequences attaching to such infringement).

35. Trophies and prize money

Winners of RASE trophies must present their trophy form (which is attached to the Prize Card concerned) to the Livestock Office in order to collect the trophy before leaving the Showground. In certain instances the Society does, however, reserve the right, at its discretion, to withhold certain trophies from being taken from the Showground.

Cheques for the prizes awarded at the Show will be sent by post to the exhibitors concerned after the Show. Any outstanding accounts due to the Society will be set-off against any prize money or other amount owed to the exhibitor.

36. 'Burke' Trophies

In the Beef Cattle Section the teams will consist of one male and one female animal from each breed and selected by the Breed Society.

In the Dairy Cattle Section the teams will consist of two female animals from each breed and selected by the Breed Society.

Health & Safety

37. Health and Safety Regulations at Agricultural Shows

In accordance with the Health & Safety legislation all livestock exhibitors/stock attendants must now comply with the above.

(Regulation 37 continued overleaf)

Regulations – ALL SECTIONS

Cattle/Sheep/Pigs/Goats

In the case of led cattle/sheep/pigs/goats it is imperative that exhibitors/stockpersons are aware of their obligations to the safety of the general public at all times whilst on the Showground and observe orders from Officials or Stewards in respect of crossing points etc.

Livestock exhibitors are reminded that the show environment can be upsetting for livestock, even those of normally placid temperament. Livestock with unstable or aggressive temperament must not be brought to the showground. When in the opinion of the Society's Officers, the Police, the Health & Safety Executive or other competent authority an animal's behaviour poses an immediate threat to life and limb of people in its immediate vicinity the Society reserves the right to instruct an authorized person to mitigate such threat in such manner as shall to that authorized person seem appropriate, not excluding the humane destruction of the said animal. By exhibiting at the Royal Show exhibitors are deemed to authorize such person or persons to so act.

Exhibitors by exhibiting at the Royal Show acknowledge and agree that the Society, its employees, servants and agents shall not be liable for any such matters as are referred to in this Regulation and in particular but not by way of limitation that the Society shall not be liable for any loss or damage (whether direct or indirect or consequential) suffered as a consequence of the Society instructing such person or persons as are referred to above. Further, each exhibitor by exhibiting at the Royal Show hereby indemnifies and agrees to indemnify the Society, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liability, claims and costs which result there from.

38. Children on the Showground

Please be aware that during the build-up of the Royal Show, Stoneleigh Park is a working site and can be a dangerous environment for children. Please ensure you are aware of where your children are and that you keep them under close observation at all times.

39. Electrical Appliances

All electrical appliances that are intended to be used within the Livestock Lines must have been inspected for electrical safety by a competent person not more than one year prior to the Royal Show and have verification of such inspection.

The Society reserves the right to confiscate and return after the Show any equipment considered to be non compliant. Nominated officials will carry out safety inspections of electrical cables and equipment. The Society's nominated electrical contractor will, at a cost to the exhibitor, carry out appliance testing on site for exhibitors with non compliant equipment.

40. Electrical Supply Cables

In the interests of safety cables must not, in any circumstances, be trailed across doorways or gangways.

41. Microwave Ovens

The use of Microwave ovens within the livestock lines is prohibited.

42. Generators

43. Dogs

Dogs are allowed on the showground on non retractable leads. Please note that there is strictly no admittance to the following areas: Livestock Lines, Food and Drink Halls and all restaurants. Assistance dogs are exempt.

Health & Welfare of Animals

44. Welfare

No person shall permit the transportation of an animal that is deemed unfit in the following states: newborn, diseased, infirm, ill, injured or fatigued or having given birth within the preceding 48 hours or likely to give birth during transport or for any other reason, in compliance with The Welfare of Animals during Transport Order 1997 or any legislation in force at the time.

45. Carriage of Livestock

Exhibitor's attention is drawn to the various requirements in the above legislation concerning carriage of livestock within Great Britain. These place a responsibility on all concerned with transporting an animal, whether or not they are the actual haulier or owner of the means of transport, not to cause or permit transport which causes or is likely to cause injury or unnecessary suffering.

46. Certification of Health (Importing/Exporting)

Livestock sent direct from other Member States must be accompanied by Certification of Health in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive for the species, including additional certification granted to the UK under Community provisions.

(Regulation 46 continued overleaf)

Animals & Animal Products (Import & Export) Regulations 2000 (as amended). Animals may be sent directly to Stoneleigh Park but RASE may not be listed as the consignee. It is the responsibility of the importer to notify the Divisional Veterinary Manager at Leicester (tel: 01162 787451) at least 24 hours prior to arrival that they are bringing animals to the Show and detailing the name of the consignee.

It is the **sole responsibility of the exhibitor** to ensure that the animal/s will be eligible to return to their Member State and are accompanied by the appropriate return certification. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the Divisional Veterinary Manager of their requirements for return certification.

47. Veterinary inspection

The Veterinary Inspectors of the Society will carry out checks on arrival of all livestock. Those animals originating directly from another Member State will be checked as required by the provision of Chapter II of the Council Directive 90/425/EEC.

Further inspections will take place once the animals have been offloaded in the Showground, and at any time the Veterinary Inspectors may require any animal to be removed to isolation for further examination or testing, following which they may be excluded from the Show.

The Society's Inspectors or those appointed by DEFRA are authorised to exclude or place in isolation any animals which, in their opinion, are exhibiting any symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any other condition which they consider warrants its exclusion or **whose identity cannot be adequately established**. In such event a certificate recording the findings of the Inspector shall be handed to the person in charge of the rejected animal.

Each exhibitor of livestock shall be responsible for payment to the Society for costs incurred as and for liquidated damages for any animal sent for exhibition which has to be placed in isolation because it is showing signs or symptoms of contagious or infectious disease, or any form of disease likely to prove dangerous to other animals.

Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring in the event of the area from which entries are to be conveyed to the Show being declared a Movement Prohibited Area, which such entries are not sent for exhibition.

48. Veterinary Treatment of animals whilst at the Show

Antibiotics, inhibitory substances, and other prescription only medicines are banned at the Royal Show unless they are administered under the supervision of the Royal Show Veterinary Surgeons.

49. Veterinary emergency treatment

It is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Officers may on their own authority give to any animal such emergency treatment as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his/her representative cannot immediately be found.

50. Veterinary charges

Exhibitors will be required to re-imburse the Society for the full cost of treatment and services, and certification administered by the Society's Veterinary Officers attending animals. Accounts will be rendered after the Show.

51. Drug administration

The Society prohibits the administration to Show exhibits (entered either for competition or sale/demonstration) of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect the performance of the animal in question or have the effect of making it behave in the Show ring in a manner which is not natural. Any exhibitor (or his/her representative) who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquilliser or drugs to any show exhibit will be dealt with at the Society's discretion. In addition the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

52. Post mortem examination

The Society reserves the right to have a post-mortem examination conducted on any animal that dies or is euthanased whilst on the Showground.

Regulations applying specifically to SHEEP

Entries

53. Registration in Flock Book

Every sheep shall be entered, or be eligible for entry, in the Flock Book of its breed in this country or when coming from another Member State an officially approved Flock Book in that Member State. Where entered by the exhibitor as "eligible for entry", proof shall be furnished to the Society if required. All sheep shall be marked for identification and/or shorn in accordance with the rules of their respective breed societies.

54. Age of exhibits

The terms 'Two Shear' and 'Shearling' shall relate to sheep born in 2007 and 2008 respectively. Lambs shall have been born in 2009, unless otherwise stated.

55. Breeding capabilities

All rams, two shear or upwards, shall have been used in the year preceding the Show and proved themselves to be stock-getters.

Regulations – GOATS

56. Nursing ewes

Nursing ewes or suckling lambs will only be admitted into the Showground if they are entered in the specific classes provided.

57. Faking and colouring

The artificial colouring of the wool of sheep is prohibited. Any sheep found to have been faked with a view to deceiving the judge shall be disqualified, and the exhibitor thereof dealt with as provided in Regulation 8.

58. Limitation on entries

The Society reserves the right to restrict entries further within certain breeds if necessary, in which case a refund will be made of the relative fees.

Health & Safety/Welfare of Animals

59. Handling of Sheep

Owners are responsible for the security of their sheep in the lines. All sheep must be led on a halter to and from the judging rings. Sheep may still be shown off the halter.

60. Records, Identification and Movement of Sheep/Goats

Exhibitors must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show.

61. SAC Sheep & Goat Health Schemes - Maedi Visna

The onus is on the MV Accredited Flock owners and exhibitors to take appropriate measures to avoid close contact with non-accredited Sheep. Sheep must originate from a recognised accredited flock in the country of origin. Members with sheep from flocks in the process of qualifying for MV Accredited Status in the SAC Scheme are advised that their sheep will be exhibited in the non-accredited section and will lose their official MV Accredited Status. Accredited facilities will be provided for Any Other Breed - Beltex, Berrichon du Cher, Bleu du Maine, Border Leicester, Charollais, Clun Forest, Dorset Horn & Poll Dorset, Hampshire Down, Lley, Oxford Down, Rouge, Suffolk, Texel, Vendéen, Wensleydale and Zwartbles breeds only, all other breeds will be housed in the Non-accredited Section. MV accredited stock must be accompanied by a valid certificate of accreditation issued by SAC or an equivalent certification from a Member State (note expiry date). The certificate should be completed and signed by the owner/manager and presented on arrival on the Showground to the official Veterinary Surgeon on duty at the Veterinary Pavilion.

62. Scrapie

Ewes which have lambed in the previous 30 days, also in-lamb ewes, may not be exhibited at the Royal Show. The owner/exhibitor must make such a declaration on his/her entry form. Sheep must not be subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern.

63. Sheep Scab and Ovine Lice

The Society requires exhibitors to apply preventative measures against sheep scab. *Sheep should be treated with a licensed product for the control of Sheep Scab in accordance with the manufacturers instructions, within the 28 days prior to their arrival at the Show.*

Ovine Lice. If Lice are found on any exhibited Sheep, the said sheep will be immediately placed in isolation and excluded from the show.

64. Docking

The Welfare of Livestock (Prohibited Operations) Regulations 1982 (as amended) requires that sheep must have sufficient tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of the male sheep. In the event of a formal complaint being received the matter will be referred to the Divisional Veterinary Manager.

65. Sheep Sprays

The use of medicinal sheep dips or phenolic purl dips on Sheep at the Show is expressly forbidden. Such substances pose a hazard to Judges, Stewards and members of the public.

66. Overstocking of Pens

If in the opinion of the Society's Welfare Officer or Veterinary Surgeon, a pen is overstocked, then such number of animals as contribute to the overstocking will be removed to the isolation pens and will not be permitted to be exhibited in the show ring. Increasing the size of a pen by extension into the aisles to alleviate overstocking is expressly forbidden. Dimensions of Pens - 6' x 4'.

Regulations applying specifically to GOATS

Entries

67. Registration in Herd Book

Goats shall be exhibited subject to the rules and regulations laid down by the Society and the British Angora Goat Society. All exhibits must be registered with the British Angora Goat Society or when coming from another Member State an officially approved herd book in that Member State, as in the ownership of and in the name of the exhibitor. The registered name and number of such exhibits shall be quoted on the entry form.

Health & Safety/Welfare of Animals

68. Records, Identification and Movement of Sheep/Goats

Exhibitors' must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show.

69. SAC Sheep and Goat Health Schemes - CAE

All Angora Goat entries must be from SAC Sheep & Goat Health Scheme - CAE Accredited Herds. Stock must be accompanied by a valid certificate of accreditation issued by SAC or equivalent certification from a Member State (note expiry date). The certificate should be completed and signed by the owner/manager and be handed in to the Veterinary Surgeon on duty at the Veterinary Pavilion on arrival.

70. Scrapie

Goats which have kidded in the previous 30 days, also pregnant goats, may not be exhibited at the Royal Show. The owner/exhibitor must make such a declaration on his/her entry form. Goats must not be subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern.

Regulations applying specifically to CATTLE

Entries

71. Registration in Herd Book and ear-marking/tag

Every animal entered for competition shall be entered, or accepted for entry in the Herd Book proper, Grading Register or other official Register of its breed in this country or when coming from another Member State an officially approved herd book in that Member State, under conditions as laid down in each breed section in the Prize List.

Ear numbers where appropriate MUST be stated on entry forms and spot checks may be carried out at the Show as to the identity of entries forward.

Dual/Triple Registrations - in the case of animals which are dual/triple registered, it is a condition of entry that animals elected to be shown in a specific breed at a previous Royal Show cannot be exhibited in another breed section at future Royal Shows, including Production/Inspection classes and the Inter-Breed Production Inspection Championship.

72. Breeding capabilities

No bull of three years of age or upwards at the closing date for entries, ie. 30th April, shall be eligible to compete for any prize unless it shall have sired at least three living calves, born within twelve months previous to the above date. The calves must be registered with the appropriate Breed Society prior to the Show.

73. Entire Bulls

Every bull entered for competition must have two testicles fully descended into the scrotum. These testicles should be of similar size consistent with the age and breed of the animal.

74. Nurse cows

Cows which have not themselves been entered for competition but which are suckling exhibits entered for the competitive classes, will not be allowed entry into any part of the Showground.

75. In-milk, in-calf classes

Exhibitors of Beef and Dairy and Dual-Purpose cattle shall certify that cows or heifers entered in the classes for animals in-milk or in-calf with second or subsequent calf have produced a living calf - or that the calf, if dead, was born at the proper time - on or after 1st August, 2007.

In any class described as for 'Cow with her calf at foot', the calf must accompany her dam in the judging ring, and cannot be older than 10 months of age.

Exhibitors of Beef and Dairy and Dual-Purpose cattle having entered cows or heifers in an in-calf class must provide, if asked to do so, certification of date of last service and subsequent calving.

Cows which have been super ovulated and flushed for embryo transfer will not be accepted as having calved.

76. Inter-class transfers - Beef Section only

A cow or heifer entered for an in-calf class will be transferred to the appropriate in-milk class in the event of calving before coming to the Show provided it does not infringe the requirements of the Welfare of Animals during Transport Order 1997 or any legislation in force at the time - see Regulations 44 and 45.

77. Cows calving on the Showground

Cows or heifers entered for an in-calf class will NOT be transferred to the appropriate in-milk class should they calve down on the Showground and any animal calving down on the Showground after competing may forfeit the prize money.

Regulations – CATTLE

78. Faking

Cows having their teats plugged or the udder in any way 'faked' or cattle found to be artificially coloured or otherwise faked in any part either at the time of judging or at any other time whilst in the Showground or any cow or heifer entered in the 'in-milk' classes, to which milk has been given during the Show will be disqualified. The team of animals in the possession of such exhibitor at the time of disqualification may be rendered ineligible for competition at the Shows of the Society including the current Show to be held in the year of such disqualification and the year following. (Regulation 8 refers). The Society reserves the right to ultrasound scan udders of dairy cows.

Milking

79. Milking parlour

Cows must be milked in the Milking Parlour where full facilities are provided for machine-milking.

The washing down of cattle at the milking points is prohibited. Clipping is also prohibited in the milking parlour.

80. Disposal of milk

Milk yielded by cows shall be delivered to the Milk Reception Depot. Payment will be made after the Show and any monies pertaining to the removal of milk received by RASE will be distributed equally amongst milking cows forward for showing. The rate of payment will be determined by the overall quality and cleanliness of the milk delivered. The following 'Conditions of Acceptance' must be met (see Reg. 81). Milk will only be accepted from cows milked in the Milking Parlour.

81. Conditions of Milk Acceptance

The Society is registered as a milk producer with the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs. It is necessary that the methods of milk production comply with the requirements of the Dairy Products (Hygiene) Regulations 1995.

Antibiotics, inhibitory substances, and other prescription only medicines are banned at the Royal Show unless they are administered under the supervision of the Royal Show Veterinary Surgeons. Where a cow is treated, it must be declared and the milk will be stored as directed by the Steward. Each exhibitor's milk is liable to be sampled and the buyer may test each tanker-load of milk on arrival at the Dairy. Should a consignment be found to be contaminated with antibiotics, inhibitory substances or other Prescription Only Medicines the Society reserves the right to test samples to identify the cows that have been treated and the exhibitor/s will be informed accordingly. The Society reserves the right to ban exhibitors found in contravention of this regulation from exhibiting at the Royal Show.

In particular, milkers with open cuts on hands or arms must keep these covered with a waterproof dressing. Spitting and the use of tobacco is prohibited. **Milkers must wear clean washable head coverings and overalls.**

Exhibitors should bring their own foremilk cup and large plastic bags in which to store milking buckets etc. to prevent contamination by dust and dirt. (Foremilk cups and plastic bags can be purchased at Milk Reception).

82. Milking-out

Cows or heifers may be required to be milked dry before competing for champion prizes and special group prizes at the discretion of the breed society concerned.

The judges may, if they so desire, order that all or any of the cows or heifers be milked out in the ring before the prizes are awarded.

General

83. Beef Cattle Data Cards

Exhibitors must ensure that official RASE/MLC/ABRI Data Cards are erected above the appropriate animals.

84. Exhibit numbers

Cattle Leaders/Cattle Stock Attendants will be issued with 'harnesses' in which to display the catalogue number of the animal they are parading.

These must be drawn from the Cattle Office in the Cattle Lines on arrival at the Show, and returned before departure. Any harnesses not returned at the end of the show will be charged for.

85. Removal of Manure

All Stalls/Pens must be cleaned out by 07.00 hrs each day commencing on the Wednesday prior to the Show and in accordance with the Steward's instructions.

Manure must be deposited on to 7th Street side of the cattle sheds only. Under no circumstances must muck be deposited on to 6th Street side. Should it be necessary to muck out during the day, 7th Street only must be used. In the interest of safety and for the convenience of visitors, manure must not be heaped in the gangways.

86. Photography

An area of Ring B will be designated for photographing cattle either when judging is complete or when a ring becomes available.

Photographing of cattle will not be permitted in any areas other than as specified above and any other area designated at the Show.

Health & Safety/Welfare of Animals

87. Handling of cattle

ALL CATTLE MUST BE DOUBLE TIED IN THE LINES.

Owners are responsible for the security of their cattle in the lines with particular reference to bulls. Exhibitors must be satisfied in all cases, and at all times, that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment is provided for use by animal handlers and where thought appropriate heifers should be trained to accept 'bulldogs' as a restraint.

Bulls: All bulls shall have rings in workable order in their noses, and with the exception of yearling bulls, if required, be led with leading sticks. Exhibitors are advised to provide two handlers for Junior Bulls during showing and parades and **MUST DO SO** in the case of Senior Bulls. The second handler may be at the head or at the rear of the bull, at the discretion of the exhibitor.

88. Movement of cattle

Cattle movements will be restricted to the following areas, except by order of the Honorary Show Director, Cattle Stewards or the Chief Veterinary Officer of the Society:

6/7th Street, Ring B, Milking Parlour and to and from areas designated for photographing animals. No animal should leave the cattle lines during the night except to be milked unless accompanied by a Steward or Veterinary Officer. Failure to comply may result in disqualification.

89. Washing/clipping facilities

Washing of Cattle - Cattle washing stances will be provided on 6th and 7th Street side of the cattle lines, also on the apron on the right hand side of 7th Street and at the end of Shed 13.

Pressure washers should only be used according to the following guidelines:

1. Pressure washers may only be used on cattle which have been trained to their use and are not distressed by them. If an animal will not stand quietly to be washed then the procedure must stop. Excessive restraint to enable pressure washing may not be used.
2. At any time, pressures in excess of 30 p.s.i. may not be used. Broad fan-type jets should be used in preference to narrow pencil-type jets. The lance should not be brought close to the animals skin. Any caked-on dirt should be removed by brush or curry comb.
3. If any animal shows signs of pain, distress, or injury pressure washing must stop immediately. If there is any break in the skin, or bleeding, that area must not be pressure washed. Particular care must be taken round the head and neck area: do not use the pressure washer directly on the animal's face.
4. If at any time an exhibitor is asked to cease pressure washing an animal by a steward or veterinary officer, he must do so immediately. The final decision rests with the society's chief veterinary officer.

Washing Times - until 07.30 hrs on 6th Street side of the sheds and after 18.30 hrs. Washing may continue at the bottom of Shed 13 and on the apron on the right side of 7th Street during the day.

Clipping - Clipping may only be carried out in the designated area of the cattle lines.

90. Obstruction in Cattle Lines

Chairs/loungers or any other furniture must be removed from the Cattle Lines during the daytime ie 7am to 7pm. For the safety of all concerned stall heel boards must not be altered or extended into the aisles.

91. Water Bowls in the Cattle Lines

Permanent attachments to the Cattle Shed Water System are prohibited. The Society will give consideration to a limited number of exhibitors in the Dairy Section who wish to install a supply of water to their cattle during the Show and a charge will be made for this service (see entry form).

The Society reserves the right to disconnect or remove, at any time, any temporary connections having given notice to the stockperson should any part of the supply, either the Society's or the Exhibitor's, cause any unforeseen problems. The Chief Steward's decision will be final.

92. Water

The withholding of drinking water to animals, unless on the direct instructions of one of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, is forbidden.

93. Cattle Identification Regulations 1998 and 2000

Exhibitors' must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show.

94. Tuberculosis Order and Brucellosis Schemes

At the date of entry cattle must be from herds which are free from restrictions imposed under: The Tuberculosis and the Brucellosis Orders.

In addition the entered animals must not themselves be under individual restrictions.

An animal accepted for entry must not be consigned to the Royal Show if, after entry, either it or the herd to which it belongs becomes subject to movement restrictions.

95. Cows calving at show

A. NORMAL FULL TERM CALVINGS

Cows which have been super ovulated and flushed for embryo transfer will not be accepted as having calved. (Regulation 95 continued overleaf)

Regulations – PIGS

Cows or heifers calving at full term on the Showground will be placed in isolation and after calving will be sampled on behalf of the owner, or his/her representative, by one of the Society's Veterinary Officers. Samples will be tested at a DEFRA approved Laboratory. If the tests are negative then the animal(s) may, at the discretion of the Society's Veterinary Officers, return to the show lines or to the herd of origin.

The owner, or his/her representative, will be responsible for the payment of any fees incurred in the taking of the samples.

B. ABORTIONS AND PREMATURE CALVINGS

These can be highly dangerous, and the following routine must be strictly observed:

(i) It is essential that neither personnel nor animals have contact with any animal in the cattle lines which has aborted or which is showing signs of aborting (eg an abnormal vaginal discharge). **WITHOUT MOVING THE ANIMAL** temporary isolation must be provided by the use of straw bales, ropes, notices etc. and **a responsible stockperson** must be in attendance pending further action by the Chief Veterinary Officer of the Society or his/her representative.

(ii) On no account must the animal concerned, nor any material from it, be removed from the standing without the authority and supervision of the Chief Veterinary Officer.

(iii) The CVO must be notified immediately and he will notify the Divisional Veterinary Manager (DVM), Leicester.

(iv) If, for any reason, the CVO cannot be contacted the DVM Leicester (Tel: 01162 787451) must be advised without delay.

(v) At the discretion of the CVO such animals will be transferred to the isolation boxes and returned to their premises of origin as soon as possible. An abortion enquiry will be carried out prior to the animals being removed from the Showground. A range of samples will be collected by one of the Society's Veterinary Officers acting as a DEFRA Local Veterinary Inspector or by a DEFRA Veterinary Officer. **There will be no charge made to the exhibitors for the taking of the samples.** Arrangements will be made for any animal subjected to an abortion/premature calving enquiry, **and any other animals at the Show originating from the same herd**, to be returned to the premises of origin as soon as possible.

The owner or his/her representative, will be responsible for the removal of such animals from the Showground.

96. Lepto hardjo Vaccination-Advisory Note

The Society advises exhibitors to vaccinate their animals (with the exception of Elite Herds) before coming to the Royal Show. This should be done on the basis of a primary course of two injections of Lepto hardjo vaccine, at an interval of not less than 4 weeks and not more than 6 weeks, to be completed at least 10 days before leaving the farm of origin and within the last 12 months.

97. Contagious or infectious conditions

Warble Fly infestation, Warts and Ringworm - any animal showing clinical signs of infestation with Warble Fly larvae, Warts or Ringworm will not be admitted to the Showground.

DEFRA require that all cattle coming direct from other member states be treated with an approved Warble Fly preparation on arrival at the Showground.

Regulations applying specifically to PIGS

Entries

98. Registration in Herd Book

Pigs shall be entered or accepted for entry in the Herd Book proper of their respective breeds in this country, or when coming from another Member State an officially approved herd book in that Member State.

99. Ear-marking

Pigs shall be ear-marked in accordance with the rules of their respective breed societies and in accordance with National legislation, and ear numbers shall be stated on the entry form for inclusion in the catalogue and may be checked at the Show.

100. Breeding capabilities

Boars of two years of age and upwards at the closing date for entries shall have sired at least three live litters, born within twelve months previous to the said date. The pigs comprising such litters (except British Lop) are to have been litter notified in the British Pig Association's Herd Book or proof of their birth must have been given to the Association.

101. Breeding Sows

Female pigs (all breeds) born before 1 January 2006 shall be eligible to compete only if in the six calendar months prior to the Show or on or after 1 January 2007 they have farrowed, suckled and reared to three weeks of age, a litter of pigs.

Female pigs born on or after 1 January 2006 and before 1 July 2006 (**BERKSHIRE, GLOUCESTERSHIRE OLD SPOTS, LANDRACE, LARGE WHITE and MIDDLE WHITE** breeds ONLY), shall have either produced and reared a litter of pigs within six months prior to the Show or produced a LIVE litter within 12 weeks of the first day of the Show.

Female pigs of the **BRITISH SADDLEBACK, DUROC** and **LARGE BLACK** breeds born on or after 1 January 2006 and before 1 March 2006 shall have farrowed and suckled a litter of pigs prior to the Show. Females born on or after 1 March and before 1 July 2006 shall farrow within twelve weeks of the first day of the Show. Female pigs of the **TAMWORTH** and **OXFORD SANDY** and **BLACK** breed only born on or after 1 January 2006 and before 1 July 2006 shall either have farrowed, suckled and reared a litter prior to the Show or produce a live litter within six weeks of the first day of the Show.

Female pigs of the **WELSH** breed born on or after 1 January 2006 and before 1 March 2006 shall have farrowed and suckled a litter of pigs prior to the Show. Females born on or after 1 March and before 1 July 2006 shall farrow before, or within eight weeks after the first day of the Show.

BRITISH LOP female pigs twelve to eighteen months old are required to be in-pig or to have produced a litter prior to the Show.

102. Litters

A litter of pigs accompanying a breeding sow shall be the produce of the sow. The litter shall not exceed the age of ten weeks on the first day of the Show.

103. Faking

The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs is prohibited as is the removal or addition of spots on pigs by artificial means (white woodflour is permitted). Any pig which is found to have been artificially coloured or otherwise faked, either at the time of judging or afterwards, shall be disqualified and the exhibitor thereof infringing this regulation shall be dealt with under Regulation 8.

Health & Safety/Welfare of Animals

104. Exhibitors risk and responsibility

Exhibitors should be satisfied in all cases that the correct and appropriate restraining method and equipment, including bats and boards, is provided for use by animal handlers.

105. Handling of Boars/Protective shields

Exhibitors must provide two competent adult handlers who are equipped with bats and boards for all boars, during judging and in parade rings. Boars will not be allowed in judging rings unless the herdspersons responsible for their exhibition carry protective shields which must be supplied by exhibitors concerned. Exhibitors names must not be displayed on either boards or bats. For the purposes of this regulation the term 'adult' shall mean persons older than 16.

106. Junior Handlers

Junior handlers will be allowed to show Females only. An adult handler of the pig must accompany the junior handler to and from the pig building and remain by the ringside during judging and presentations. When showing in mixed classes and all Inter-breed competitions the adult handler must remain in the ring with the junior handler during judging and presentations.

The onus is on the owners/exhibitors or guardians to ensure the safety of the junior handlers at all times.

107. De-tusking

All boars aged 12 months or over on the first day of the Show must have had their tusks cut prior to the Show. Any boars which do not comply will not be eligible to be judged in their class.

108. Records, Identification and Movement of pigs to and from shows

Exhibitors must ensure that they comply with the requirements of national legislation in force at the time of the Show. All pigs from Scotland must be accompanied by a Schedule 3 declaration under Article 9 of The Pigs (Records, Identification and Movement) Order 1995 or an equivalent declaration from an EU Member State in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive in force at the time, including additional certification of freedom from Aujeszky's disease. Pigs from Northern Ireland should be accompanied by certification provided by the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, including additional certification of freedom from Aujeszky's disease. Any pigs that are sold or otherwise disposed of or are not returning to the premises of origin must be licensed from the show under a Schedule 7 licence issued by a Diseases of Animals Inspector of the Warwickshire County Council, who can be contacted via the Pig Steward.

If pigs are to travel direct to another EU Member State, certification in accordance with the appropriate Trade Directive in force at the time, must be obtained from the Divisional Veterinary Manager.

109. PDNS/PWMS

The RASE require a declaration from the owner on a health documentation form issued by the Society to be completed within 48 hours of departure of the pigs (listed on the entry form) to the Showground, confirming that **PDNS or PWMS has not been diagnosed on the premises in the previous 6 months** and that there have been no unusual numbers of abortions or premature farrowings in sows or gilts or deaths and weaknesses in young piglets, not attributable to known diseases within the previous 8 weeks. This declaration must accompany pigs to the Showground and **must** be handed to the Official Veterinary Surgeon on duty at the Show entry point (Stock Entrance) or arrival at the Showground.

RASE Livestock Exhibitor's Privacy Policy

The Royal Agricultural Society of England respects the privacy of its exhibitors and in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 is committed to protecting your privacy and respecting the privacy of others.

The RASE and its wholly owned company Stoneleigh Park Limited will use your information together with other information for administering your remittance and animal entry forms, as well as for marketing, customer services and profiling your entries. We will disclose your interests to other departments within our group who will then use your contact details to keep you informed of future events we believe may be of interest to you. Your details will be used to compile our livestock & equine catalogue, and those exhibitors who receive an award will have their name and county posted on our website and their name and address details made available to the national press.

We will retain your personal details for at least 3 years from your last entry to enable us to process your details more efficiently should you enter again.

You have a right to ask for a copy of your information (for which we charge £10.00) and to ask us to correct any inaccuracies. NOTES

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE

The Society reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations, or Schedules, and to settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show and exhibiting at the Royal Show shall constitute a proof of an undertaking by the exhibitor to be bound by the decision of the Society in the interpretation and application of these Regulations.

PROTESTS

An exhibitor, breeder, or member wishing to lodge a protest having reference to livestock or equines exhibited at this Show shall do so on a printed form for the purpose, obtainable from the Secretary, and shall deposit with the Society the sum of £25. If on investigation the protest is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Honorary Show Director and Steward or Stewards of the section in which the exhibit in question is included, the deposit may be forfeited to the funds of the Society. All protests shall be delivered to the RASE Office in the Showground before seven o'clock on the evening of the day on which the awards in the said section have been made, and no protests will be accepted afterwards, unless a satisfactory reason be assigned for the delay. In the case of one-day exhibits the protests shall be made immediately after the award is given.

All exhibitors and persons admitted into the Showground shall be subject to the Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Council.
