A Muslim Prayer room will be available all day Tuesday to Friday at the Arthur Rank Centre.

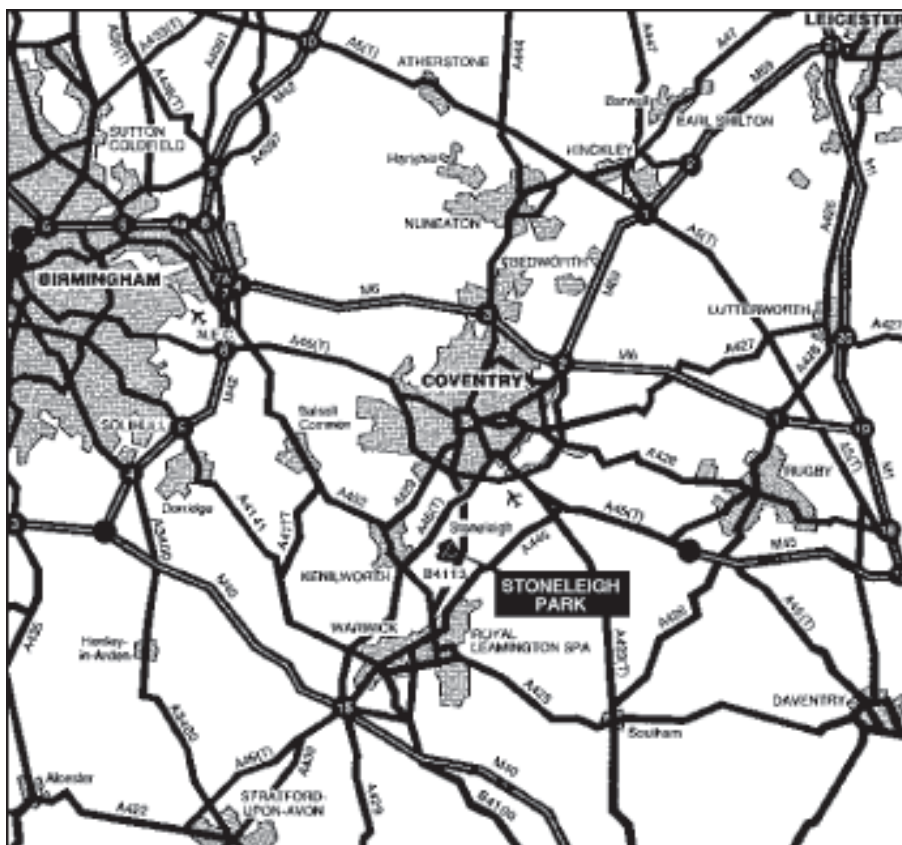

How to find us:

The Royal Agricultural Society of England is based at Stoneleigh Park, which is readily accessible from most parts of the country. It is very close to the main motorway network, with the M1, M40, M42, M45, M6, M69 all nearby; Coventry inter-city rail service is only 10 minutes away; Coventry Airport is only 5 minutes away at Baginton; while Birmingham Airport, with its domestic and international flight schedules, is 20 minutes away. Stoneleigh Park and Stoneleigh are signposted on the main roads into the Showground, i.e. the A46, B41 13, A452 and A45.

The best 5 scores, or, all clear rounds, will go forward to the second round, which will be against the clock. In the event of equality, faults and time will decide i.e. the faster four faulters will qualify. All scores in the first round will be carried forward to the second round. Competitors in the second round will start in the reverse order of merit or the slowest four faulters will go first, the faster clear last. If necessary, those who do not reach the second round, faults and time in the first round will determine their placings.

If a competitor withdraws from the second round he/she will not be replaced and he/she will receive the placing from the first round.

At least five prizes have to be awarded.

REGULATIONS FOR SHOW JUMPING COMPETITIONS

1. All competitions are held under BSJA rules, as stated in the conditions and are confined to registered horses and ponies to be ridden by Members in accordance with BSJA Rule no 79
2. Each entry must be accompanied by the appropriate entry fee and, under the provisions of BSJA Rule No. 79.5. 50% of the fee paid will be refunded if notification of an entry is made to and reaches the Show Secretary not later than 48 hours before noon of the day on which the first affiliated competition of the show is scheduled to start. BSJA Membership and Horse Registration numbers must be included on the entry form. Nomination entries will not be accepted.
3. **Prizes will be awarded or withheld according to BSJA Rule 76.6.**
4. **BSJA Rule 96.2 will apply**
5. The entry fee does not include provision of a Loose Box and, if required, these must be reserved and paid for at time of entry at £32.00 per night. Mangers will not be provided. No refund of any fees paid in respect of Loose Boxes will be made in the event of the horses concerned not competing at the Show. Hay will be available at £5 per bale and should be ordered and paid for at time of entry.
6. The number of entries in each competition may be limited at the discretion of the organisers, who reserve the right to refuse or reject any entry without reason therefore.
7. Owners must declare their horses as Starters by 6pm the night before the day of the class. Failure to declare will mean disqualification (**Declarations Office is situated within the Stable Managers Office and can be telephoned on 02476 858295**)
8. Substitution entries will be permitted under the provision of BSJA Rule No 79.4

9. Dress. **Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse for any reason (BSJA Rule 101) unless service uniform is being worn.** All competitors must wear uniform or hunting costume or appropriate coats. Failure to comply may involve disqualifications.
10. When a standard has been reached in any Competition, the Judges may retire any competitor making more than a certain number of faults if they consider this absolutely necessary.
11. Competitors will be permitted to inspect the course dismounted only during the times allocated for this purpose.
12. Each exhibitor will be granted free seating facilities at the ringside when the Jumping Competitions are in progress.
13. No horses, other than those entered for Competition, may be brought to the Showground

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE

The Society reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations, or Schedules, and to settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show and exhibiting at the Royal Show shall constitute a proof of an undertaking by the exhibitor to be bound by the decision of the Society in the interpretation and application of these Regulations.

PROTESTS

An exhibitor or member wishing to lodge a protest having reference to honey or honey products exhibited at this Show shall do so in writing to the RASE Secretary and shall deposit with the Society the sum of £25. If on investigation the protest is not sustained to the satisfaction of the Honorary Show Director and Steward or Stewards of the section in which the exhibit in question is included, the deposit may be forfeited to the funds of the Society. All protests shall be delivered to the RASE Office on the Showground before seven o'clock on the evening of the day on which the awards in the said section have been made, and no protests will be accepted afterwards, unless a satisfactory reason be assigned for the delay. In the case of one-day exhibits the protests shall be made immediately after the award is given.

All exhibitors and persons admitted into the Showground shall be subject to the Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Council.
